

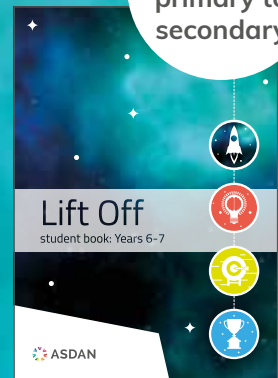
4 ways that Lift Off can be used to improve primary to secondary transition

1

Model 1: primary to secondary

- Lift off is introduced in term 5 of Year 6.
- Learners complete the starters and challenge 01 from all three modules (Awareness, Aspiration, Attainment) at primary school.
- Learners move to secondary school and complete challenge 02 from all three modules in terms 1 and 2 of Year 7.
- Certification and celebration event at end of term 2 in secondary school. Event is attended by parents and primary school staff.

Model 2: primary to secondary

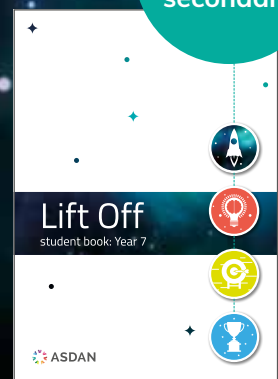
- Lift off is introduced in term 6 of Year 6.
- Learners complete the Awareness module in primary school.
- Learners move to secondary school and complete the Aspiration and Attainment modules in term 1 of Year 7.
- Certification and celebration event at end of term 1 in secondary school. Event is attended by parents and primary school staff.

Model 3: secondary schools

- Lift off is introduced at the Year 6 introduction (taster) day at secondary school.
- Learners complete the Strengths and Possibilities challenges from the Awareness module during their taster day.
- Learners move to secondary school and complete the remaining challenges from the Awareness module in the first two weeks of Year 7.
- Learners complete the Aspiration and Attainment modules in terms 1 and 2 of Year 7.
- Certification and celebration event at end of term 2 in secondary school. Event is attended by parents and primary school staff.

Model 4: secondary schools

- Lift off is introduced in term 1 of Year 7.
- Learners complete all challenges across all modules in terms 1 and 2 of Year 7.
- Certification and celebration event at end of term 2 in secondary school. Event is attended by parents.
